Letter from the Founders

ENTHRONED

Nothing could have prepared us for 2024. In the midst of running our ministry in rural Kenya with 220 staff, 520 children, 5 programs, and 24/7/365 busyness, two huge landslides suddenly struck our Naomi's Village Home property and the surrounding communities in early May. In an instant, hundreds were left homeless, 60 bodies were strewn across the landscape, and there was mayhem and need in every direction. Some of the dead have never been found, presumed to be buried under thousands of tons of rocks, mud, trees, and other debris. Fortunately, Naomi's Village Home lost none of its children or staff.

Winston Churchill was famous for stoically saying, in the wake of WW2, "Never let a good crisis go to waste." There is purpose in the trials, the stresses that almost overwhelm, and even in death. Naomi's Village joined with a group of nonprofits to take this crisis head on. Rescue, relief, rebuilding, and restoration have followed, thanks to over \$660K given by our donor base. We found another gear, by His grace and with His strength. In rebuilding homes, roads, drainage, and bridges, and in counseling wounded psyches, we have said yes to the incredible challenges God gave us to live out this year.

And there is little surprise that we see Him still enthroned, in the suffering and in the peace that has grown in our community of believers ever since. God did not leave us, forget us, or sit idly by while we suffered. And many of you played an immeasurably important role, by giving to and praying for our children, staff, and broken community. What was once layered in mud and despair has since emerged like spring after a hard winter, green and beautiful and hopeful once again.

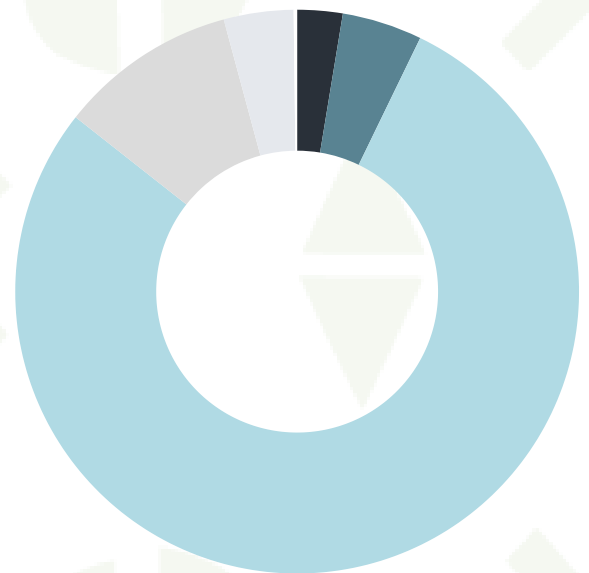

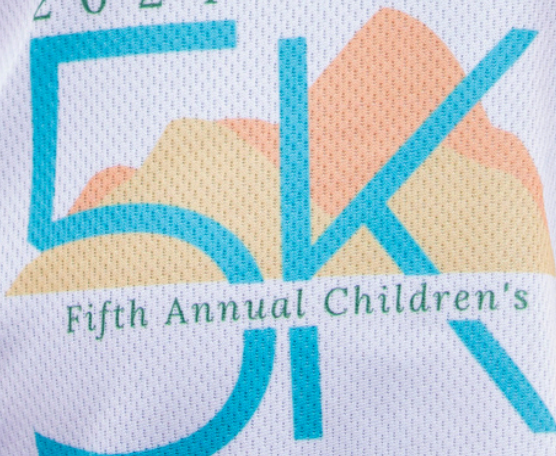
24 event sponsors and 120 golfers made this first annual tournament a great success.

HOPE BEGINS

In April 2024, Hope Begins registered with the Charity Commission in the UK, partnering with Naomi's Village as a new charity and offering more accessible giving opportunities for UK donors. Hope Begins provides a platform for UK child sponsors and donors to contribute in GBP, with the added benefit of claiming Gift Aid, which results in an additional 25% from the UK Government.

By the end of 2024, Hope Begins had 13 monthly child sponsors, collectively contributing £475 per month, totaling £527.35 with the inclusion of Gift Aid. Beyond monthly sponsorship, £1,912.05 was raised through the Naomi's Village Children's 5K in October.

Additionally, two UK child sponsors had the opportunity to visit their sponsored children in Kenya.

PATHWAYS OUT OF POVERTY

Nicholas Aswan, born into a family in Kamore, Kenya in April 2020, faced considerable obstacles to success in life. Blocking his path were stifling poverty, fatherlessness, an unemployed mother, and the needs of a physically disabled older brother.



Poverty meant growing up without clean water, adequate food, safety, decent housing, toys, clothes, a local playground and library, or any social connections with which to escape his predicament. The cycle of hopeless lack common to so many rural Kenyans had consigned generations of his family members to live like this, without resources and opportunities to escape, nor to provide their own children a way out. One main impediment stood between young Nicholas and driving a wedge into that vicious cycle, ending it forever for his family– a quality education.



Fortunately, LEAP Preschool's assessment team found him at age 3. His family's desperate situation qualified Nicholas for admission through the use of a unique poverty assessment tool. A five-domain developmental assay proved he could succeed. Nicholas was likely spared from serious learning delays because of healthy attachment with his loving mother.



Just one year later, Nicholas is now thriving as a second year LEAP student, his days a rich medley of healthy play, multifaceted learning, literacy, excellent nutrition, and a safe environment. LEAP's programs have been helping to strongly wire his brain neurons, building connections for success that will serve him for life. As long as he continues matriculating each year, soaking in the holistic education provided by our K-12 school, that terrible poverty cycle will surely end for Nicholas' family. As he recently said to his mother while walking to school, "I want to build you a better house some day." That's how we know we are creating a lasting legacy through Naomi's Village. Rescuing children like Nicholas from lack and trauma would have been satisfaction enough. But far better to leave ripples on the surface of time, a new generational legacy of service to others that spreads and grows until millions are helped to also thrive one day.
